I am very pleased to report that on Monday our attendance for the term at Tokanui School was at 99%. Well done everyone! It is very rewarding to have the children all returning to school at Alert Level 2. Well done to all of the parents who prepared the children well and helped them to feel confident about the return. The teachers have also done a great job of introducing the new routines and ensuring the children feel safe back with their onsite school learning.

We are required to send student attendance data to the Ministry weekly, from 29th May. The purpose is to report to the National Crisis Monitoring Centre and government on levels of attendance during the COVID-19 period.

Thank you to those who have been picking your children up from outside the office and texting to get your children sent out. This has been an efficient way to get children out of class without interrupting the classrooms and limiting the number of adults coming on to the school grounds. This system will continue, however if you want to come onsite outside class hours you can if you sanitise and sign in through the Office. We do want to keep communication up with our families so if you have anything that you wish to discuss with your child's teacher, just phone the office and we can arrange for the teacher to ring you or you may wish to make a meeting time.

Mrs Short has kindly offered to give us her services to support group learning in Team Karaka and to create an "Our Bubbles 2020" mural. Your children need to discuss with you the first name of each person that was in their Alert Level 4 bubble so that we can record these on the bubbles that they paint. Looking at their practice work, I think these are going to be great and will provide a bright new look outside the library area.

Lunchbox Ideas

- 1. *Try to include plant-based proteins in your lunches*. Use hummus as a dip with fresh veggies, soy beans as a snack and add chickpeas/kidney beans to leftovers.
- 2. *Roll it, stuff it or spread it.* Try different breads to keep lunches interesting like wraps, pita bread, fruit bread, muffin splits or rewena bread. Choose wholegrain.
- 3. *Cut sandwiches*, fruit and vegetables *into different shapes* using a biscuit cutter or knife.
- 4. *Use heart healthy spreads which are* nutrient-rich on sandwiches such as avocado, hummus, nut butters.
- 5. *Make items in bulk and keep* in the freezer eg mini pizzas mouse traps or frittata.
- 6. Add lemon juice to cut up fruit (apples and pears) to stop them going brown.
- 7. *Choose water*, the best drink for your child.
- 8. *A frozen drink bottle or icepack* helps keep milk products and meat/meat alternatives cold until lunchtime. Frozen bread also helps keep fillings cold.
- 9. *Involve your children in lunchbox choices and preparation*. You could make your own health lunch at the same time.
