These are skills for life that we all have to use at some time.

All of our students have Seesaw accounts which became very useful during lockdown and online learning. We continue to use these for a variety of reasons. Seesaw gives all students a voice and makes their learning visible. It helps to build ownership in their learning, builds their reflection and creation skills. It is a way that they can share their creations and gain an authentic audience. It can build strong communication between home and school. Teachers are developing how they can best use this tool and parents can engage with it as well to support your child's learning by being an audience and giving feedback. Only signed up family members can see your child's account. No other parents or community has access to it. Ways that you can engage include: Like their work by tapping the heart, write a comment or you can record a voice comment on their work by pressing the microphone symbol. The best comments help children to learn something new. "Can you tell me more about. "

.. " "I wish I understood why. . . " " I am curious about . . . " Be positive and build each other up. "This was interesting to me because..." "I think you did a great job because... " "I really liked ... about your post. Have you thought of... Have a go and try a new way of responding to your child's work. All children are capable of extraordinary things. They all have potential. While we can't change the fact that they will come up against challenges along their journey in life, we can give them skills so that they can hold their head high as they navigate these challenges. We can build their resilience. Resilience is being able to get back up and try again, carry on and bounce back from stress, tragedy, trauma or adversity. Resilient children are braver, more curious, and more adaptable. Resilience can be strengthened in children. According to Hey Sigmund, 2019, "Where the Science of Psychology Meets the Art of Being Human", "Building small humans into healthy, thriving big ones isn't about clearing adversity out of their way. A little bit of stress is life-giving and helps them to develop the skills they need to flourish. Strengthening them towards healthy living is about nurturing within them the strategies to deal with that adversity." The first step to building resilience in children is strong relationships. The presence of at least one supportive relationship. A loving, caring adult can make a difference in the life of a child and their ability to develop vital coping skills. Let them know about the people in their fan club. Anything that you can do to build their connection with the people who love them will strengthen them. 'I told Grandma how brave you were. She's so proud of you.'

Playground time is an opportunity for our children to learn a lot about building relationships and playing fair. With the shorter lunchtimes, the children get quickly outside and make the most of their time playing with their mates. In the survey around how safe they feel in the playground and classrooms many of the children referred to their friends that looked after them. It is so rewarding to hear a child take responsibility for their mistake and apologise for accidently hurting someone else and then show them that they care about them by looking after them as I saw yesterday.
