


Term 4 No 2 21st October 2020

Tena koutou katoa,

We have welcomed **Constable Rosie** into our school this week to work with the children on the Kia Kaha programme. This is a programme aimed at dealing with bullying. The children learnt about the importance of talking to someone when they have a problem, they learnt about accepting differences and about respecting each other. Some of the children created Planet Kaha – their own perfect place to live and others worked through scenarios where bullying had occurred. Constable Rosie will be back later this term to follow up with the classes.



Attendance for the Year to date. Well done everyone we are sitting at almost 93% present with just 2.5% unjustified absences. This does help us to provide support for children that need it, children feel a sense of belonging because they aren't missing out or coming in to part way through new learning programmes. We can only teach them if they are at school. Well done to our

community as this is not the trend throughout the country since the lockdowns.

Enviro Schools continues this year with classroom teachers taking this in their own classes as well as our leaders meeting and taking ideas back to their classes. Enviro Schools is integrated into the classroom programme this year. Classes have all planted some vegetable plants, some have been looking into worm farming, encouraging the staff to put suitable rubbish out for the worm farm, the seniors built planter boxes for all of the classes out of old pallets and they are also looking at painting the picnic tables in the house colours and making other improvements around the school grounds. The Enviro Schools teachers have met with the new Environment Southland educator and discussed how we can move forward towards the 'Silver Award.' Miss Taylor is working with the children to develop a plan for the next three years. We have a lot of projects on the go. The Enviro Leaders have had a walk around the school where they have identified opportunities to further develop areas and will share these with their classes. Our next step is to take this information and document it into manageable steps for our plan. On November 27th we are planning an Enviro Day where all children will be in house groups to work around four stations then end up with a tree planting. The community is all welcome to join us on this day.

We are excited about **Pet Day** on Friday. You are all welcome to come along and enjoy a catch up while the children get to show off their pets. Remember that Monday is Labour Day. Next week we will be welcoming Theresa with the **Life Education Truck**. Parents are welcome to come along to the parent session on Tuesday at 2:30pm in the truck.
