It has been an interesting start to the school year with the flooding affecting travel to and from Tokanui. Now that we can get through Fleming Road, it isn't so far for those of us from out of town.

Our Year 7 & 8 students left for Cromwell Camp on Monday morning with Mrs Poole, Mrs McMullen and the parent helpers. I will be swapping with Mrs McMullen on Wednesday afternoon. It was really cold in the wind while the children waited to get on the bus but it wasn't far up the road before we got a message saying it was so hot – 25 degrees at Alexandra. They will have a great week with plenty of opportunity to get into the water and make the most of the warmer weather.

The children are learning about and making kites that they can enter at the Edge of the World Art Exhibition. This is a great opportunity for them to create something for a real audience. We are planning to get them down to see the Exhibition working around the SwimSafe programme which will take place in the afternoons this year.

SwimSafe is made available to us thanks to REAP who partially fund the programme and Home and School support this for our children also. It works very well because the children are taken in small groups based on their ability; something that the teachers can't do during class swimming because of the student to teacher ratio. The focus of SwimSafe is now around safety in and around water with the aim of reducing the number of deaths by drowning in New Zealand. Drowning is the number one cause of recreational death. "In 2018, 68 people lost their lives to preventable drownings and the five year average is 82 fatalities", according to Water Safety NZ. There are so many different water sports available to our tamariki and we have water for recreation wherever we go in New Zealand so I believe that it is very important that our children are confident in the water and have some swimming skills. Swimming Club has started again on Monday nights and I encourage all families to take up this local opportunity where your children can learn to swim. Swimming Club is not run by the school so if you are making enquires please contact Moira Short.

not too many bags.




