Kia ora everyone

Welcome to our first New Entrant for 2020, Lucy Watson! What a time to start school. Lucy has been contributing to Online Learning through SeeSaw. What a way to start school! Lucy will have a very unique story to tell in the future about her start to schooling at Tokanui School.

As I am sure that you will all be aware, the decision about moving between Alert Levels will be announced by the Prime Minister on Monday 11th May. If the decision is made to move to Alert Level 2, the earliest that we will go back to school is Monday 18th May. This will be the start of Week six of a 12 week term. The end of term date is July 3rd, this would give us seven weeks of schooling onsite.

The Prime Minister has advised that in Alert Level 2 schools are safe environments for children, young people and staff and that additional public health control measures are in place to prevent the spread of disease and to support contact tracing. The key Public Health approach is to minimise the risk that someone gets infected in the first place, and second to ensure we can identify and contact anyone who has been in close contact with a person if someone in a school is infected.

At Alert Level 2 we will require anyone onsite to be recorded on our register with contact details. This is for quick and accurate contact tracing. We will continue with good hygiene practices, including staff and students coughing into their elbows, handwashing/drying and regular cleaning of commonly touched surfaces.

Under Alert Level 2, any students and staff who are sick or have flu-like symptoms are to stay at home and we will send anyone home immediately if they show any symptoms while at school.

It's important however that not just at school but at home, safe hygiene habits are practised by everyone, as this is essential to minimise the risk that someone gets infected with Covid-19.

The staff and I are really looking forward to meeting with the children onsite again. Hopefully this will be soon. At this stage I don't know where we stand with sporting events but the Southland Cross Country has been cancelled. Please remember that we are still in Alert Level 3 and need to continue to stay in our bubbles until we get notified otherwise. Meanwhile, keep up the great work supporting your children's online learning and encourage them to keep up some fitness.

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


