#### **Disturbing Clip on Tik Tok**

You may be aware that there is a disturbing clip which has gone viral on Tik Tok.

Netsafe are working on removing the clip from sites where possible. Netsafe have advised the following:

For now, we recommend that students are being made aware not to share or view the footage as it can be highly distressing content. We recommend that having regular, open conversations at home around online safety is important to help young people navigate the myriad of digital challenges they will experience.


