Kia ora everyone

The children are very concerned that our new worm farm lid blew away in the wind yesterday. If you see a rectangular black plastic lid that has come off our worm farm, please return it to the school office. The wind has really got it in for us this spring!

We had a furry visitor to our Assembly last Friday. Percy the Possum was watching us from on the roof! He caused great excitement and luckily didn't fall down. We think the roof might have been too hot for him to scuttle across. Magic show – last Friday our students were treated to the Vas Kovalski Magic Show around healthy eating.

I was interested to see in this month New Zealand Education Gazette a study that a group of schools had done using Tuakana-Teīna to improve oral language skills. They have found not only an improvement in the oral language skills for both the tuakana (older child who tutor) but also for the teīna (younger child who is being tutored), but improved playground relationships and behaviour.

"... the relationships that the kids built together are just phenomenal in that they go and talk to each other in the playground. In that one school, all the behaviour problems they had in the playground basically went away because there was the positive mixing and role modelling." (NZ education Gazette).

We run our Tuakana-Teīna programme every morning for the first 15 minutes of the day. The routine is clearly established with our younger tamariki taking their books and racing off to meet up with their buddy. When observing the children during this time they are seen engaged, on-task, relaxed and learning. One of the most powerful parts of this programme is the relationship built and the connection between the tuakana and teīna and this carries over into our playground. Buddies are carefully matched and change each term. During this time the children read, practice their Early Words, share their writing or other tasks that arise. They are also building their oral language skills as they cooperate together. The learning happens for both the tuakana and teīna.

Today we have Constable Rosie back in the school to deliver the second part of the Kia Kaha programme with our students.
