A note from our Principal:

Kia ora everyone

What a wonderful week our senior class had on camp in Dunedin. Lots of activities and getting to know the city. They got to dissect a Dog Shark, played minigolf as well as ten pin bowling and bounced around Leap. They visited the Early Settlers Museum, studied art around the city and stayed the night in the Otago Museum. They sang along with Karl on the Ukulele to Six60's "The Greatest", while standing outside 660 Castle Street where the band used to flat. After Karl sent a video to Chris, from the band, Chris agreed to a Facetime call later that evening so that the children could ask him questions. What a very cool opportunity for all involved. The students all took advantage of the opportunities presented to them and have bonded well as a class. Thank you to the parents that came along and helped Mrs McMullen make this camp an awesome experience for our seniors.

On the last Thursday of term we will be holding a special event where caregivers can come into the school and join in or see the children working on some art projects. This event is called Creative Connections so if you see it on the calendar you will know that this is an opportunity for you to visit your child/ren's classroom.

Thank you to the parents that have been helping with athletics practice. We really appreciate your expertise and support with this. We are looking forward to Southern Zone Athletics on Friday.

At Tokanui School we take a PB4L (Positive Behaviour for Learning) approach to behaviour management. Our behaviour management is values based and we congratulate the good. When the children are in the playground they can randomly earn House points (posi's - positives) for behaviours that are in line with our school values. The teacher on duty wears either the school jacket or a hi-viz vest so that the children can see where they are. This helps to reassure children if they know that the teacher is nearby. When an incident happens, children are encouraged to own their behaviour and decide with the teacher what they can do to put things right. The teachers teach what is expected of children in different situations. It is easy to assume that children will know how to behave, but we know that if we take the time to teach routines and expectations, we get better results. Tuakana Teina time reinforces the family atmosphere and helps younger children make connections with older children. We are very proud of how well behaved the Tokanui Children are and I know that I can count on them when they are out and about representing our school.

Help with essential costs

Work and Income may be able to help you, even if you're working

If you can't work at the moment, have lost your job, or are working fewer hours

- You may be able to get a benefit or some other financial help from us.
- If you're struggling to pay your rent or your bills, you might be able to get some help - even if you're still working or on a low income.
- We can also help you look for work or training and help with the costs of getting started in a new job.

If you're sick or need time off work because of COVID-19

If you're being tested for COVID-19, it's important you stay home until your results come back. If you can't work from home, your employer may be able to apply for the Short-Term Absence Payment to help them pay you.

If you've been told to self-isolate because you or someone you've been in contact with has COVID-19, and you can't work from home, your employer may be able to apply for the Leave Support Scheme to help them keep paying you.

Talk to your employer about the help that's available so you can keep getting paid. If you're self-employed and can't work from home, you can also apply for these payments.

Depending on your situation, there are lots of other ways we may be able to help you and your family. You don't need to be on a benefit to get help, it's also available to people on a low income. We could help with:




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
