He panui na to maatau Tumuaki: A note from our Principal:

This week is Bullyfree Week and on Friday we are recognising this by joining many others around the country by wearing a Pink top for 'Pink Shirt Day'. Pink Shirt Day is one way to celebrate the diverse, wonderful people around us and a way to take meaningful steps to prevent bullying.

Every morning our students take part in Tuakana Teina time. Older students are paired up with younger students and they both share some learning with each other. This can be a time to practice oral language, listening skills, reading a familiar text and spelling. The children quickly move to this activity at 8:45am when they arrive at school and can be seen engaged and socialising with students from another class. This is beneficial for both the tuakana and the teina. We consider this a very important part of the day and a great way to break down barriers that can lead to bullying. Please ensure that your children are at school on time every day so that they can get settled in and have the benefit of this important part of their day. In Term One this year it was noticeable that children were not being taken off school early in the afternoons. This is an excellent support to their learning and feeling of belonging in the class.

What a fantastic day we had last Wednesday at Slope Point. There was so much learning going on with a number of excellent presenters. Trips in our local area provide such rich learning opportunities. There will be opportunities for the seniors to revisit some of this learning while at Deep cove next week. All children will be able to apply this learning when developing our own outdoor classroom.

Good Luck to our Year 7 & 8 students who are all away to the Bowls competition on Thursday. They have really improved and upskilled with all of the practices that they have been having.


