



He panui na to maatau Tumuaki: A note from our Principal:

Kia ora community

This is my last newsletter as the Principal of Tokanui School. I have mixed feelings about the end of my time at Tokanui School. I am excited about my new beginnings as Deputy Principal at Ascot School and I am also sad to be leaving Tokanui where I have so many happy memories and connections with awesome people, especially the wonderful children at this school.

Matariki Celebrations on Friday at school were a wonderful end to the term. It was so good to have so much involvement from families - we had representation from 42 families out of 49! It was such a lovely atmosphere with the lunch that the Home and School put on; they fed 100 people! A bit of a change with burgers and they were delicious. Thank you to all those who helped on the day. Through our involvement in the Lower Mataura Valley Kahui Ako (COL), we are part of a pilot programme called Te Hurihanganui which aims to address racism and provide education that meets the needs of all children. We have received funding that we can spend to support this programme. The lunch on Friday was paid for from this funding and it certainly did bring everyone together and encourage building connections. We were lucky to have the Angel Bay Patties donated from ANZCO. If you like them and want to get more they are available in the supermarkets. Because we are part of the Kahui Ako, we have the support of the Hokonui Runanga who invited us to have this Matariki Celebration and supported the day with personnel. On Monday at lunchtime a large group of children from all classes were playing Ki-O-rahi again. It is awesome that the day helped to spark this interest. Later in Term Three there will be a Ki-O-rahi tournament for the Year 5-8 children.



School Reports will be sent home with the children at the end of the week. Next term in Week Three there will be Learning Conferences with the teacher your child has now. These conferences are based on the information in the school report.

Finally, farewell and thank you to everyone who has supported me over the last eight and half years while I have been at Tokanui School. I have loved my time here and thoroughly enjoyed working with your children. The support of parents and caregivers is never taken for granted as I know that we are unique with the whanau support that we receive. We have a great team at the school: Our teachers are committed to the wellbeing of the children, our teacher aides are skilled and capable, we are lucky to even have a Librarian. Our caretaker keeps our school looking the best in the country, and the cleaners just get the job done and keep our school clean and hygienic. Everything comes together with our outstanding skilled Office Manager who ensures that everyone knows what is going on and children get to where they need to be while supporting me in my role as Principal. I also would like to recognise the Board members that I have worked with over the years that I have been here. They give up their time to Govern the school in the best way possible. Managing funds, staffing and the strategic path of the school. The commitment of the Board is appreciated and I have enjoyed working with them all.


